TROPICAL STORM WATCH AND WARNING NOTIFICATION
MAGDALENA GRAND BEACH & GOLF RESORT

This is a precautionary measure. The Trinidad and Tobago Meteorological Service (Met Office) on Monday, has issued an updated warning as of 8am this morning: a Tropical Storm Warning has been issued for the twin islands of Trinidad and Tobago. This means tropical storm conditions are expected within 24 hours. At this time it will be mostly torrential rains and high gusts of wind and rough seas.

The Met Office earlier stated that T&T was not under any tropical cyclone watch. Potential Cyclone #2 was located at approximately 1200 km east-southeast of Trinidad. It is moving at 37 km/hr and is expected to continue west-northwest, intensifying over the next 36 hours. A potential tropical cyclone is a disturbance that has not yet become a tropical cyclone, but which poses a threat of bringing tropical storm or hurricane conditions to land areas within 36-48 hours.

The resort is taking the precaution to remove all furniture from the beach and pool areas, and will be serving dinner from the Pembois Restaurant only for the next 36-48 hours till the island is given an “all-clear” by the Met Office. Again, gusty winds and street/flash flooding are likely in areas of heavy showers or thundershowers, and the possibility of landslips/landslides exist. Sea conditions are expected to worsen and will affect marine and coastline interests.

We kindly ask that all guests stay within their rooms after 10pm tonight Monday till 7 am on Tuesday. The resort will regularly keep all our guest and staff informed of any and all changes.
